## LET'S END PLASTIC POLLUTION THIS EARTH DAY!

Sunday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> is Earth Day, the largest environmental movement in the world! This year's Earth Day campaign is to End Plastic Pollution, an important subject that we address in our programs at the LHCCC. The Great Lakes hold 21% of the world's surface fresh water and 1.5 million residences are provided with drinking water from Lake Huron and Georgian Bay. Lake Huron receives approximately 600 metric tons of plastic pollution annually, which can pose a significant threat to water quality and wildlife. When present in aquatic environments, plastic acts as an attractant for toxic persistent organic pollutants (POPs), like dioxins and DDT. Many species of waterfowl and fish mistake plastic for food, allowing these toxins to enter the food chain and presenting many hazards for the survival of these animals.



One of the ways we work to address plastic pollution on Lake Huron is by holding beach cleanups along the shoreline. Beach cleanups are a great way to raise awareness about plastic pollution and encourage people to become involved in coastal stewardship. This year we are holding the Great Goderich Cleanup on Earth Day weekend. Last year at our Goderich cleanup we had over 100 volunteers clean up over 700lbs of garbage!

Earth Day is an opportunity for people to take part in activities that improve their local environment, and is an excellent reminder that we can all make small changes every day that have a big impact. Come out and show your support to Mother Earth by getting involved with the annual Great Goderich Shoreline Clean-up to help remove shoreline trash from our Great Lake! But, your contribution doesn't have to stop there. There are many ways you can help reduce the amount of plastic entering this incredible resource. We can all make responsible eco-friendly choices such as:

- Packing litter-less lunches
- Using reusable shopping bags instead of plastic grocery bags
- Saying "NO!" to one-time-use plastic straws and cutlery at bars and restaurants
- Using reusable water bottles and coffee mugs
- Reusing (or substituting!) plastic sandwich/snack bags

These steps may seem small, but they are great ways to help reduce our impact on our Great Lake and protect the wildlife who call the waters of Lake Huron home.

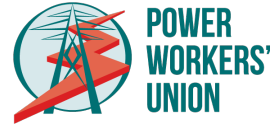
